



U25 and U18 Mixed Doubles

Curling has an opportunity to make use of extra arena ice at this season's U SPORTS / CCAA / Mixed Doubles Championships in Fredericton. Therefore, we would like to 'field test' or pilot a U25 Mixed Doubles event and a U18 Mixed Doubles event running concurrently to the main events. These are to be considered test events and not championships and will be operated by Curling Canada.

U25 Mixed Doubles details

Dates: March 15-17, 2019

Location: Willie O'Ree Centre (arena ice), Fredericton, NB

Entry Fee: \$100 (all returned in prize money)

Prizes: Each round robin game winner will receive \$30 per team. Playoffs: 1st - \$140; 2nd - \$100; 3rd - \$80; 4th - \$40 (per team)

Teams: this is an open invitation to one male and one female both a maximum of 24 years old and under on December 31, 2018. Entries will be accepted for **Atlantic-based teams** only.

Resumé: teams should describe their individual curling history / successes since May 2015. Points will be awarded for international / national / provincial / regional success as well as cash tournaments.

Format: 8 team round robin; top four teams to the semi finals (no tiebreakers). Eight end games.

Coach: each team must be accompanied by a coach who is 21 years old and over with a minimum Competition Coach Trained (Competition Introduction).

Dress code: all three members must have matching uniforms with last name across the back shoulders. No cresting restrictions.

U18 Mixed Doubles details

Dates: March 22-24, 2019

Location: Willie O'Ree Centre (arena ice), Fredericton, NB

Entry Fee: \$100 (all returned in prize money)

Prizes: Each round robin game winner will receive \$30 per team. Playoffs: 1st - \$140; 2nd - \$100; 3rd - \$80; 4th - \$40 (per team)

Teams: this is an open invitation to one male and one female both a maximum of 17 years old and under on December 31, 2018. Entries will be accepted for **Atlantic-based teams** only.

Resumé: teams should describe their individual curling history / successes since May 2015. Points will be awarded for international / national / provincial / regional success as well as cash tournaments.

Format: 8 team round robin; top four to semi finals (no tiebreakers). Eight end games.

Coach: must be accompanied by a coach who is 21 years old and over with a minimum Competition Coach Trained (Competition Introduction).

Dress code: all three members must have matching uniforms with last name across the back shoulders. No cresting restrictions.

Logistics

1. Each game will be scheduled for eight (8) ends.
2. Each team shall receive twenty-two (22) minutes of thinking time and two 90 second time outs, includes travel coach time. There will be a three (3) minute break after the completion of the 4 th end.
3. When extra ends are required, the clocks will be reset, and each team shall receive three minutes (3:00) of thinking time for each extra end. (One 60 sec time out)
4. After the pre-game practice, using all eight (8) stones, teams will choose the five stones they want to play with and shall keep those five stones for the entire game.
5. Power Play Option: Once per game, each team, when they have the decision on the placement of the “positioned” stones, can use the “Power Play” option to position the stones.
6. The team having the decision on the placement of the “positioned” stones shall be:
(a) Teams opposing each other in the game shall use the Last Stone Draw (LSD) to determine which team has the decision in the first end. The team with the lesser LSD distance shall have the decision on the placement.
(b) Following the first end, the team that did not score shall have the decision on the placement.
(c) If neither team scores in an end, the team that delivered the first stone in that end shall have the decision on placement in the next end.
(7) While the team is in the process of delivery, the non-delivering player on the same team must be positioned either inside the hog line, with at least one foot on the ice surface at the playing end of the sheet, or in a position to sweep at the delivery end of the team’s sheet.
(a) After delivery, either or both players may sweep their delivered stone and any stones set in motion that belong to their team anywhere in front of the tee line at the playing end.
(b) If a player delivers a stone out of proper rotation, the delivered stone is removed from play and any displaced stones are returned to their original positions by the non- offending team. Should the infraction not be discovered until after the delivery of a subsequent stone, play continues as if the infraction had not occurred.
(8) The event will be fully officiated by a Curling Canada’s Chief Umpire and appropriate Game Umpires.
(9) Pre-Game Warm-Up:
Warm-up begins 20 minutes prior to game time. Teams will be allowed six (6) minutes of pre-game practice time per team before all games at the scheduled game time (including playoffs). The choice of position in the first end of all games will be determined by a draw to the button. Following each team’s six (6) minute pre-game practice, each player will deliver a stone to the button - one (1) clockwise and one (1) counter-clockwise. Each stone’s distance from the pin hole is measured. The combined total is your last stone draw distance. Full sweeping is allowed. For the purpose of ranking, the highest combined distance of the seven games will be discarded. The remaining total distance for the round robin will be used to rank teams. Each player must throw a minimum of 3 clockwise and 3 counter clockwise draws during round robin play.
(10) Playoffs
(a) For all championship games the team with the better round robin record will have choice of either hammer OR colour of stones (The team with the hammer will practice first). If teams have the same round robin record, a draw to the button will be used to determine the hammer, (same procedure as the pre-game warm up) with the team having the lowest total distance of the draws for hammer during the round robin (best 6 of 7), having choice of either rock color or practice time.
(b) For the first games within the championship round and the quarter-finals the teams will use the stones from the specified sheets.
(c) In the semis and final, the four teams will be able to choose sets from designated sheets at the discretion of the Chief Umpire.
